# PRINCIPAL ACTIVITY

The Society was set up with the following principal aims:

- To lobby, publicise and campaign to encourage the Board of Leicester City Football Club to take into account the interests of supporters when making their decisions.
- To create an independent forum to raise the concerns of Leicester City Football Club supporters.
- To enable a democratically elected director representing the views of supporters to influence the decision making of the Board of Leicester City Football Club, and to enshrine in the football club's Memorandum and Articles of Association the representation of the Trust on the Board of the Club.
- To raise money for the benefit of the club. Funds raised are to be used appropriately as to benefit the best interests of Leicester City Football Club and its supporters.
- To strengthen the bonds between Leicester City Football Club and the community which it serves and to represent the interests of the community in the running of the club.
- To ensure the club meets the highest standards of business management.
- To promote, develop and respect the rights of members of the community served by the club and the Trust.
- To encourage the club to play competitive football at the highest possible level.

#### **BUSINESS REVIEW**

Throughout the year representatives from the Trust attended and participated in the Leicester City Fans Consultative Committee sessions and other meetings between the club and fans. Most of these meetings took place online. There has been regular Trust Board attendance at the Premier League Trust meetings and at national meetings organised by the Premier League and the Football Supporters Association. These have taken place face to face and online.

During the year the Board Chairman has continued to have phone and email correspondence with representatives from the club. The Trust Board also continues to liaise with the club regarding issues which have been raised by members.

Representatives of the Trust Board continue to do tv, radio and press interviews regarding the club and general footballing issues when required.

The Trust AGM in February 2022 was held at the King Power Stadium with an additional online link for the first time which enabled members living a distance from Leicestershire to take part. At the AGM members continued to support the retention of surplus funds in a deposit account so that they are available in the event of shares in Leicester City Football Club becoming available for purchase.
