Current State & Challenges:

Whilst we have supported club or third-party organised events, we have yet to host our own.

The club's reluctance / slow moving decision process has blunted our attempts so far to make an event which has maximum exposure.

As a new group, it's very much been testing the waters and the ideology moving forward is to be more innovative within our own right whilst given group members autonomy to separate projects.

The community group aids the visibility of the Trust which cross-references the groups of communication and membership.

Desired Future State & KPIs:

- To create a culture of events which support community causes whilst celebrating the club's history and heritage.
- Regularly have a Trust presence at fanzone or adjacent location on matchdays.
- Members only dialogue events which are an exchange of opinions – Town Hall etc.
- Establish a number of partners and contacts which help assist our goals and aims.
- Begin to have a larger presence on national FSA events and organisations. Therefore, assisting in national campaigns.

Member only event & public event which aids Trust visibility and membership.



To have the ability to regularly pitch at events with 'stand' such as fanzone, independent events and other community organisations.



Raise a large amount of money for the Goal Difference LCFC in The Community Campaign.

Latest Progress:

- Club/LCFC in the Community wish the wording regards partnership to be dropped and replaced that the Trust raising donations for the Goal Difference cause. This relates to the legal agreements etc.
- Previous grounds run for Community scheme – difficulty in agreeing date which allows the Trust to maximise coverage.
- NON-LEAGUE DAY. Board discussed possible destinations to host a Trust pitch at a local non-league venue and whereby the club may give a discount for ticketing. Harborough Town with previous Trust links was discussed but the thought was to support a club where the impact of additional attendees were felt. Subsequently post meeting, St Andrews were selected and they have committed to free admission for any Trust members.
- MEMBERS ONLY EVENT – We discussed the ambition to have a members only event (or Members first refusal). Our previous target for a guest has been unsuccessful. We discussed about doing a celebration of the title win with a target date in second week of May. CAUSES – 1) For thru Trust to provide materials and equipment which children can create flags for matchdays. Club have cited concerns on branding and fire regulations. We have requested can we provide designs for honesty flags, but we have been told the club already have a school-based process for this. 2) Dementia - Partnering with Age UK. We initially investigated how we could assist hosting dementia cafes or similar. LCFC in the Community already run such events but we can assist with volunteering from our Trust members if appropriately qualified.
- TRUST AWAY DAY – We explored the possibility of setting up a Trust presence at one of the forthcoming away games. Pompey Trust assisted with some venue recommendations – one pub was willing to open and provide a discount for members. We believe the Trust should attempt to carry this out but later in the season with better fixture date security.

Next Steps/Actions:

- Agree date for run. Question Leics CCC over the use of their ground as the starting point. Request ask to the King Power Stadium if a non-matchday.
- Trust attendance at St Andrews game on 28th March for non-league day.
- Explore venues to host any members only event.
- A call for any volunteering to Dementia Cafes.
- Discuss within board the away day idea.
